

During the last couple of weeks, our children AND teachers have been busy preparing for our Cultural Festival. Children have been working hard to perfect their moves with teachers guiding them and supporting them. Looking around the school and feeling the excitement of the children, I am reminded about a lovely prayer that was shared with me many moons ago and it is a prayer that I often fall back on and reflect on. May this prayer be a reminder to us all that in life and in dance, when God is leading us, we too, will perfect our 'lives' and our 'moves'.

Dance With God

When I meditated on the word GUIDANCE, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing. When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky. When one person realizes that, and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music. One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another. It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes surrender, willingness, and attentiveness from one person and gentle quidance and skill from the other. My eyes drew back to the word GUIDANCE. When I saw "G," I thought of God, followed by "u" and "i." "God, "u" and "i" dance. God, you, and I dance. As I lowered my head, I became willing to trust that I would get quidance about my life.

My prayer for you today is that God's blessings and mercies be upon you on this day and everyday. May you abide in God as God abides in you. Dance together with God, trusting God to lead and to guide you through each season of your life. AND I HOPE YOU DANCE! Enjoy the Cultural Festival!!

Once again, I became willing to let God lead.


